The workshop was inaugurated by Dr Renuka Ramaiah (In- charge Dean) ; Dr Thomas Prasannaraj, Medical Superintendent; Dr Yoganandan K S, Deputy Medical Superintendent. The resource persons were Dr Vivek Dorai, Deputy Director-Medical, Aarogya Soudha, Department of Health and Family Welfare, Government of Karnataka, spoke about the reasons for implementation of POCSO, why it is important for medical practitioners and how to approach a victim and accused of sexual offence?.

Dr Jagadeesh N, Professor and Head of the Department, Forensic Medicine, Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences encrypted a mind blowing sessions and enlightened about the 4 pillars of practice, which a medical practitioner should practice viz., being legal, scientific, ethical and gender sensitive.
